<sup>1</sup> A student may petition to have the 6-credit study abroad requirement reduced or waived under circumstances of extreme hardship or in the event of program cancellation.

<sup>2</sup> CHIN/FREN/GRMN/JAPN/KOR/RUSS/SPAN 4500, “Intercultural Seminar” is the only required language course and is ONLY offered during the spring semester. Note that a student with a valid scheduling conflict may substitute SPAN 4699 (Undergraduate Research) for SPAN 4500 (Intercultural Seminar) with approval from the Director of Undergraduate Studies and/or Associate Director of Undergraduate Studies. Valid scheduling conflicts include co-oping, interning, or studying abroad in the spring semester of one’s senior year or needing to take another required major course in the same time slot in one’s senior year.

<sup>3</sup> “To obtain more than one undergraduate degree, a student must complete all major required courses for the specific degree programs and earn credit for a total of at least 36 credit hours in excess of the requirement for any previous degrees earned. Students should work with their advisors to ensure the additional 36 hours for each additional undergraduate degree are not being counted multiple times across those degrees” -Rules and Regulations XIII Undergraduate Degrees, Section F
