CHINESE 3693: CONVERSATION PRACTICUM SYLLABUS ; LBAT 2019

Instructors: Dr. Jin Liu, Dr. Xiaoliang Li and Mr. Chao Li and local tutors

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Description: The objectives of this course are 1) to raise your level of proficiency in speaking, listening to, and writing Chinese by applying classroom learning to real life situations; and 2) to develop cultural awareness via interviews with local people. You will raise your level of language proficiency by putting the Chinese you are learning in your Chinese 3691 “Chinese for Current Events”, Chinese 3692 “Business Chinese”, and Chinese 3696 "Economic Development and Sustainability" classes into practical use in a variety of everyday situations in the community outside the classroom. Everywhere you go will be your classroom and everyone you meet will be an informant. Guided by questionnaires, you will learn in situ about Chinese history, geography, language, nationalities, social and political structures, education, transportation, manners and mores, cuisine, festivals, medicine, health maintenance, family, housing, and attitudes toward the United States and their own country, etc. Interviews will enhance your speaking and listening skills; writing reports and making presentations will give students a unique opportunity to express personal experiences in Chinese.

This course will be held over nine weeks in Shanghai and Qingdao. Course activities include 1) guided interviews with local people, 2) topic-oriented, instructor-led field trips, 3) report writing (about 300 characters) based upon interviews and fields trips, 4) one-on-one Monday and Wednesday tutorial sessions on editing and correction, and 5) Monday and Wednesday student “debriefing presentations” (about 5 minutes).

Practicum Interview topics can be tailored to student interests and language levels. Initially these will be little more than conversations. As students become more familiar with the local community and accustomed to speaking Chinese on a daily basis, they will become more sophisticated (profound), topic-focused dialogues. Interviews will focus upon assigned topics but they can encompass other subjects that arise spontaneously. Students will present written activities reports in class twice weekly.

Course Agenda:

- MW 11:45am – 12:45pm in class
- Monday-Friday: practicum activities.
- Attend group cultural or business site visit (to be reported in writing & presentation).
- Monday-Wednesday individual 20 minute tutorial sessions, including 5 minute debriefing presentations.
- Fridays: 1:00 – 6:00 pm; group cultural or business site visit in conjunction with 3691, 3692, and 3696.
- Weekends and free time: Practicum Interviews, report composition, and presentation preparation.

Course Requirement Recap:

One page activity report (about 300 characters). Try to include comparisons with your experiences in the US. Turn in writing to instructors during twice-weekly tutorials. Do not procrastinate.

Debriefing Presentation. Prepare a 5 minute Chinese language debriefing presentation on your topic. This should include Q & A with your classmates, who will quiz you with questions about your practicum, and may also be quizzed by you!

Critical or frequently-used vocabulary list: Highlight 15 to 20 frequently-used words, phrases, or expressions that you attempted to employ in your writing and list any words, characters or phrases that might be unfamiliar to fellow students.

Grading:

- **Practicum activities: 10%**
- **18 journal entries: 45% (2.5% each)**
- **18 debriefing presentations: 45% (2.5% each)**
